The fundraising programme is central to the Fauna & Flora 2030 objective of at least doubling our annual income to circa £80m.

The Institutional Funding team focuses on positioning Fauna & Flora with priority statutory donors and professional foundations and building knowledge and capacity of these donors across Fauna & Flora, to secure new income, to support excellent grant and relationship management, and to influence the shape and focus of donor support for conservation globally.

Purpose:

To support Fauna & Flora to raise significant restricted and unrestricted funding from an allocated portfolio of priority Trusts & Foundation funders, with a focus on managing existing relationships to grow and maintain long-term and successful partnerships. To lead strategic planning for key accounts and work with internal stakeholders to produce compelling and high-quality concepts, proposals and reports for donors ensuring alignment with our 2030 strategy.

Responsibilities:

Relationship management

- Develop and implement organisation-wide donor engagement/stewardship plans for key donors from an allocated portfolio
- Provide excellent relationship management, including leveraging events, our programme of work, and senior colleagues in Fauna & Flora to retain and uplift support.
- Ensure an ongoing pipeline of funding opportunities, commissioning and coordinating research and establishing best project fit and most effective method of engagement; with a particular focus placed on donors capable of providing 6 and 7 figure grants
- Identify and lead on opportunities to add value to donor relationships outside of formal reporting requirements, including but not limited to, meetings, donor visits, media sharing and events
- Support the coordination and feed into briefings for CEO and other staff members around meetings (happening globally) with key Foundation representatives
- Ensure effective knowledge management of portfolio through excellent administration via the use of Fauna & Flora's database and internal systems

Development of high-quality fundraising materials

- Collaborate with colleagues across Fauna & Flora to develop and review high quality and compelling communications, proposals and reports for trusts and foundations, ensuring alignment with organisational priorities and donor requirements
- Where appropriate, feed into project design to ensure planned work is logical and robust

Strategy

- Contribute to the planning and implementation of Fauna & Flora's Trusts & Foundations
 Fundraising Strategy, and wider Institutional Funding plans as part of the Institutional Funding
 Team
- Contribute to quarterly team planning and reporting processes to support the team's efficient operations

Other duties

- Stay abreast of current conservation practice through liaison with programme teams, and attending seminars, team meetings etc as relevant.
- Support the review of grant agreements working with the Legal team to ensure appropriate alignment with Fauna & Flora's programmatic, communications and organisational needs
