We're proud to say that 90% of our income goes towards charitable activities, so you can be sure your donations are making a real difference.




Setting up your fundraising stream

We use the fundraising platform **Tiltify**.


Getting started with Tiltify is really quick and easy – just follow these simple steps!

- Head over to https://tiltify.com
 and click on Start Fundraising!
- 2. Create a fundraiser account and fill in your details.







4. Choose a campaign name (you can choose this, be creative!) and write a short description.




Choose a campaign goal. £150 per 1000 Twitch followers is usually a good guideline.



5. Connect your livestream or Twitch channel.



7. Add the finishing touches - a schedule, rewards and milestones. Remember to publish your campaign so everyone can donate!



Spread the word

So, you're ready to start streaming? Great! The next step is to get the word out and start generating interest in your stream!

WHEN?

Start promoting your stream around one month beforehand. Let your friends, family and followers know the date and time of your first stream.

WHAT?

Let your followers know what they can expect from your stream and ask them what they want to see.

WHERE?

Let your followers know where they can find you. Share your Twitch channel with them and your Tilltify fundraising page.

WHO?

Let people know about the awesome cause you're going to be streaming for (us!). Tell them about the great stuff we do and share our socials so they can find out more.
